HOW TO APPLY FOR A USI

As a Newman student undertaking a Vocational Education & Training (VET) course, First Aid and/or White Card qualification, you will need to have a Unique Student Identifier (USI) number. A USI is a reference number made up of numbers and letters, unique to each student and is an online record of VET training undertaken in Australia. A USI number will stay with the student for life and must be recorded with any nationally recognised VET course undertaken.

PAYMENT METHOD

All payments are to be made through the communication and school management platform COMPASS. Upon enrolment, into any Catholic School in NSW using the Compass platform, each parent/guardian and each student receives a separate identification number and login to Compass. General College Uniform

- Knee length black skirt, black pants, or black knee length shorts (bearing NSTC initials on the waist band).
- Black College polo shirt or white blouse
- College jacket
- College hat or cap
- Black polishable enclosed footwear
- White or black socks

Early Childhood Education & Care and Human Services Uniform

The following items are essential for the above courses:

- Black College polo shirt or white blouse
- Black College pants and/or black College knee length shorts (bearing NSTC initials on the waist band)
- Enclosed black polishable footwear
- White or black socks

Female students are not permitted to wear the College business skirt while undertaking practical exercises in these courses.

Hospitality Uniform

The following items are essential for the above courses:

- Chef check pants
- Black full length apron
- Black shirt
- Black chef's hat
- Enclosed black polishable footwear

All students choosing Hospitality - Cookery or Food & Beverage are required to undertake kitchen operations and wear the above listed uniform.

Construction, Furniture Making and Electrotechnology Uniform

The following items are essential for the above courses:

- College yellow high-visibility long sleeve trade shirt - limited short sleeve shirts are available but not recommended if you intend to wear in industry where outdoor work is common
- Navy long or short 'drill' work pants
- Black work boots - steel-capped preferred (brown not acceptable)
- A Safety Pack is essential for all trade students, including safety glasses, hearing protection and dust mask. This is available to purchase from the College or local suppliers

Manufacturing & Engineering, Automotive and Plumbing Uniform

The following items are essential for the above courses:

- College navy trade shirt - short or long sleeved
- NB: If the student's subject selection also includes Construction, Electrotechnology and/or Furniture Making, it is acceptable to wear the yellow high-visibility trade shirt in the Manufacturing and Engineering, Automotive and Plumbing courses, however they may not be as durable in these greasy environments.
- Navy short or long 'drill' work pants'
- Black work boots - steel-capped preferred (brown not acceptable)
- A Safety Pack is essential for all trade students, including safety glasses, hearing protection and dust mask. This is available to purchase from the College or local suppliers
