As a condition of enrolment and in order to meet NSW Education Standards Authority requirements, students must participate in the Workplace Learning Program (on-the-job training). This involves working on a one-day-per-week basis throughout the year and for block periods of one week.

The purpose of the Industry-based Learning (ILB) course is to enable students to demonstrate the additional knowledge, understanding, skills, values and attitudes they develop from on-the-job training. It will assist in addressing the challenges faced by students who concurrently undertake the Higher School Certificate and formal industry training.

Across the days of compulsory Workplace Learning attendance, students will have the opportunity to develop skills for their VET competencies.

By engaging in on-the-job training, students will develop knowledge, understanding, values and attitudes about enterprise, work and industry and a range of employability related skills valued within and beyond the workplace. Students will gain experiences that can be applied to a range of contexts including work, study and leisure and which can assist them in making informed career decisions.
